Seesaw

Are you on Seesaw yet?

A QR code came home in your child's reading folder last week.

Follow the steps to download the app

(if you don't have it already) and once approved by the class teacher, you will be able to see your child's journal.

Green reading folder and PAIR book

This folder is to come to school and go home each day.

In it, you will find reading material with a journal to fill in, word lists and any other communication we send home. Mondays are when the Newsletter is prepared and we will usually send any notes or messages in the folder on this day.

Today your child will bring home a blue bag containing a PAIR program book.

The PAIR titles come home on a **Monday** and are collected up on a **Friday**. This is a Term One only program.



Parent Assisted Immersive Reading (P.A.I.R.) is an at-home read-aloud program that accelerates reading readiness in young children.

It is designed for use with students in their first year of formal schooling. The program involves parents regularly reading aloud to their child while at the same time engaging them in meaningful conversation about the book. *P.A.I.R.* storybooks are specifically designed for this purpose. They come with vital prompts, tips and questions that allow parents to effectively enrich each reading session.

Follow the instructions in the book to read it with your child each night or watch the short video below.



How to read a PAIR book with your child

This book will also be used in the classroom and it is important that your child is familiar with the story.

Some students will benefit from following the program as it is designed and read it each night, going a little deeper each time.

Others may only need a couple of reads and then go back to the take home book on the other nights. You will be able to gauge where your child is at but talk to your class teacher or Kylene if you are unsure.



Volunteering at Our Lady Star of the Sea

We will begin our Volunteers officially in Week 6, once Preps have settled into school and referee checks have been completed.



If you would like to volunteer as a helper in the Hub, attend excursions etc, we are offering a session to explain the paperwork required, expectations we have of our volunteers and some strategies for working with the students in your care on:

All are welcome, but if you have attended this session in previous years or have your paperwork and already volunteer within the school, there is no need for you to attend this session.

Timetables for class help and PMP will go up on the Prep Noticeboard soon (situated inside the automatic doors). Kylene will often put any reminders or last minute messages on the whiteboard here too.

You can add your name to a timetable for a time that suits you, remembering that you will need to be an approved volunteer.

You may choose to volunteer fortnightly and alternate with another parent.

SHROVE TUESDAY

Tuesday Feb 25th is Shrove Tuesday.

This week your child will start to be introduced to the characters in the Kimochi Program that we use to complement our Social Emotional learning.

What are Kimochis?

KEY.MO.CHEE means "feeling" in Japanese.

Kimochis look like toys, but they are actually tools; communication tools that help kids manage feelings in positive ways to promote well-being and success in school and life. These tools will help us deal with big feelings.



Which Kimochis® character are you?





There has been lots happening in Prep already, apart from the set up of routines and expectations and of course, eating and going to the toilet!

- Morning circle, where we come together in a positive way to start the day with a fun welcome, prayer and time for special announcements happening in the lives of our Preps
- Learning how we can talk to God, setting up the Prayer Space and making the Sign of the Cross
- Our first Big Draw, an introduction to our Big Write program across the school
- PMP
- Sounds in words, where we focus on one sound each day for the rest of the term. This can be hearing it at the beginning/middle/end of words, generating other words that sound like this, identifying the syllables in the word and pronouncing the sound correctly. These sounds include the more complex of oo, or ai etc, not just the 26 letters of the alphabet.
- Letter activities that give lots of fine motor skill practice such as cutting, tracing and drawing
- Reading Big Books together that are interactive and provide opportunities to further develop their early reading skills.

• Number work: reading, recording, modelling and counting numbers at their own level. It may be manipulating numbers to 5, 10, teens or to 100, depending on where they are currently at.
