#### **CURRICULUM OVERVIEWS**

### Literacy:

This term in writing we will begin with a focus on Persuasive Texts. The children will be looking at the structures of a Persuasive Texts, emotive language, punctuation and language features.

Here is our first Big Write topic for this week that we encourage you to discuss at home with your children. The more the children can orally discuss their ideas around writing concepts and organise their ideas and thoughts, the greater success they will have with their writing.



We will continue to focus on sustained reading and developing an enjoyment of reading. We are striving to have children think more deeply about texts, including discussing the author's purpose and critically evaluating what they read.

#### Maths:

The focus for Maths will be Number and Place Value. This will include concepts such as reading and writing to the millions, expanding numbers and knowing their value, ordering numbers and modelling them on a number line, skip counting and rounding numbers.

During Independent Learning, the children will begin focusing on Business and Economics to plan their business. This will be an ongoing project for the term.

## **Religious Education:**

The focus for the beginning of the year across the school is working together in Faith, Hope and Love. We will look at ways that Jesus teaches us that what we do flows from who and what we are and that together we can differences in the world. We can enlighten the world with the message of the gospel, because our lives have been transformed, changed by that gospel and now we ourselves are light for others. We can serve others in various ways, only because we have been saved by God's grace and now we are agents of that grace in the lives of others. This will connect to our Inquiry Unit on Civics and Citizenship.

## **Inquiry:**

Our Inquiry Unit has a focus on Civics and Citizenship with a big question of 'Can we as part of a community make a positive change to our world?' The children will Identify an issue that they wish to solve, who is responsible for it and how they can influence others. Through research they will find out about an important issue, test their own assumptions and develop arguments that are backed by data. We are encouraging children to be active citizens who take action on issues important to them and who negotiate with those who have the power to change things.


## **YEAR 6 INFORMATION 2020**

Today we went to Sea Views Manor and we interviewed the elderly people. Glenn was our host and he introduced us to some of the residents and paired one resident with two. I was with Chloe.

I spoke to three people the last one I spoke to didn't talk but her son was answering for her. I thought it was really nice because the lady, Mary, was 93 and she was sitting next to her husband who was 99 and their son and their daughter in law were helping them and they were all staying together.

They were super nice and I enjoyed hearing about their life. Mary was at school during the war and she grew up in Adelaide. Her favourite subject was sport and her hobbies were horse riding and sewing.



Today we went to Sea Views Manor. We went and Interviewed some elderly people about their lives and this man said that he was in the Commonwealth bike race.

I thought it was cool and I asked some questions and he said that school was good and said that his grandchildren are at Star of the sea.
