## Werribee Zoo

We are very excited to be heading off to Werribee again this term for another excursion to Werribee Open Range Zoo to support our Integrated Inquiry Unit "Helping Hands in our Connected World." This excursion will give the students the opportunity to investigate 'Life in a village in Africa'. This program

#### LUNCHBOX REMINDER

#### Carry In, Carry Out to Reduce Food & Packaging Waste

A recent school wide audit of all bins across our school over a four day period revealed that approximately

18-20kgs of food waste was collected, including over 15 whole or nearly whole apples in just FOUR DAYS!! Food wrappers were also identified as a "very high" waste category, with two x-large garbage bags of plastic lunch waste collected in those four days across the school.

We'd like to remind you that our school promotes a Nude Food and Carry In, Carry out approach to food waste and food packaging. Please encourage your child/children to bring home any popcorn, chip, muesli bar, yoghurt packaging and also uneaten food so you can see what they enjoy and aren't eating and adjust lunches accordingly.



Keep an eye out for some simple tips to assist with this over the next few weeks.
